Custody is up to the court - not me, you, Janice, Norman, your parents or anyone else. It's high time you realized this. And according to the court's current order, I have sole custody, and not only in Michigan but in any state. (This is why I was able to bring Mohan back from New York last year too, which is something your idiot dad doesn't understand.) I can delegate Mohan's care to someone else, like Norman and Janice, through a power of attorney, which gives them the legal right to care for Mohan in my absence. (But only in my absence - when I go to Providence, only I have any legal rights over Mohan.) You don't have custody, but only visitation rights (in Michigan, and nowhere else), and your parents don't have even that. Which is why you and your mom

were sent packing by the cops when you tried to break the law by forcing your way into Janice and Norman's home.

So, no - you will not have shared custody, even if you live in Providence with Janice. And if you want to see him again, you will have to do that in Michigan. If you try to circumvent this, by trying to see him in Providence, you will be breaking the law.
